Laabs wins state journalism award

Joyce Laabs, The Lakeland Times' feature writer, was recently honored with the 2002 Journalism Award for the large weekly news story category by the Wisconsin Association of Aging Unit Directors for her story about cryo-surgery performed by Dr. Richard Roach late last year.

The story, which appeared on the front page of the Friday, Nov. 29, edition of The Lakeland Times, described the Cryoablatin procedure performed by Roach and a team from Cryo-Med at Howard Young Medical Center last fall.

It was the first time the procedure had been performed in the state and The Lakeland Times was the first to report it.

Laabs' story was recognized as the winning entry by the state association April 28.

Entries to the contest were to recognize "outstanding coverage of issues about or of importance to older adults."
